I. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

II. STATE WETLANDS BUREAU PERMIT

A) Standard Dredge and Fill Application 71 Baycliff Road, Portsmouth, NH Aquila Chase

The Commission recommended **approval** by an 8-0 vote.

III. CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT

A) 500 Spaulding Turnpike Home Depot

The Commission recommended **approval** of this application by a 7-1 vote.

B) 1855 Woodbury Avenue Starbucks

The Commission recommended **approval** by an 8-0 vote with the following stipulation:

1. That the vegetation buffer shall be maintained between the site and the adjacent mobile home park.

III. OTHER BUSINESS

A) New Hampshire Association of Conservation Commission's Membership

The Commission voted unanimously to pay the 2006 Membership Dues to the NH Association of Conservation Commissions in the amount of \$825.00, to be paid from the Conservation Commission budget funds.

B) Discussion of goals, objectives and strategies as outlined in the 2005 Master Plan

Discussion was held on prime wetland designation being done by Mark West, of West Environmental Services, the creation of a sub-committee to review natural resources in conjunction with the Zoning Ordinance update, and review of the Open Space Plan.

C) Coach Road Conservation Fund Recommendation

The Commission voted unanimously to recommend to the City Council that \$994.40 be taken from the Conservation Fund to reimburse the City's contingency fund for pro-rated taxes from the December 1, 2005 tax bill.
