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The City of Portsmouth Coastal Resilience Community Meeting

PORTSMOUTH, NH – The Portsmouth Planning Department has completed a study analyzing potential coastal impacts related to projected sea level rise and storm surge caused by climate change. The project identified potential impacts on buildings, infrastructure and natural resources under a range of climate change scenarios. The study identifies potentially vulnerable areas in the future and recommends policies, plans and regulations to respond to the projected impacts of these climate-induced changes. Funding for the study was provided by the Gulf of Maine Council through a grant from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.
