CITY OF PORTSMOUTH

CITY COUNCIL POLICY No. 2018-02

LICENSE FEE FOR ENCUMBRANCE OF CITY PROPERTY

Any party temporarily encumbering city property for purposes of construction, other than one or two family dwellings, beyond thirty working days, shall apply to the City Council for a license and pay the following fees:

- A. Metered parking spaces -- \$35 per day per space, \$50 for spaces in the high occupancy zone
- B. Any other City right-of-way / land, including but not limited to unmetered parking spaces, travel ways, loading zones and sidewalks \$0.15 per square foot per day

The license fees set forth above will be doubled if the license period extends beyond its terms.

Any encumbrance that extends beyond thirty working days without an approved City Council license shall also be subject to the above fees.

The City Manager may waive the license fees for parking in unmetered spaces if the applicant can provide equivalent public parking in the immediate vicinity of the licensed area.

The Public Works Director shall administer the application of the License fees under this policy.

Any party that disputes the application of this policy to its request for a license may appeal to the City Manager.

FEE COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

Municipal Complex Portsmouth NH

A motion was made by Councilor. Dwyer and seconded by Councilor Raynolds to approve the minutes from the February 2, 2018 meeting. Unanimously approved.

- 1. <u>Valet Parking:</u> No change from fees presented. Councilor Dwyer suggested that a footnote be added to the Fee Schedule stating that Valet parking is only when the restaurant is open and that the parking spot can be used when not in use by the Valet. Councilor Raynolds also suggested that adding signage for the 15 minute parking spots to include that they become regular meters when the business is closed. City Manager Bohenko asked Mr. Fletcher to provide an inventory of the 15 min parking spots.
- 2. <u>Snow Ban Parking:</u> No change from fees presented. The purpose of the lower rate at Foundry Place is to encourage residents to park in that facility.
- 3. <u>High Hanover Parking Facility</u>: Councilor Dwyer suggested leaving the Special Event parking at \$5 and not increase it to \$10. She suggested the use of additional advertising for Foundry Place. The committee agreed to keep it at \$5. No other change from fees presented.
- 4. <u>Foundry Place Parking Facility:</u> No change from fees presented. Councilor Dwyer reiterated the need for additional advertising. City Manager Bohenko said that the Foundry Place Garage will be well lit to encourage use of the facility.
- 5. Peirce Island Overnight Boat Launch: No change from fees presented.

City Manager Bohenko stated that Parking Fee Revenue saves the average homeowner 84 cents on the tax rate for approximately \$240 savings per year.

Councilor Raynolds asked if there was a way to allow residents to get a special rate to use the Parking Facilities through the use of a special app. Mr. Rice stated that residents get a 25 cent discount by using the EZ park transponder.

Councilor Dwyer asked if the Fee Schedule could include Resident Onsite Neighborhood Parking as TBD. The Committee agreed.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:48.
