# **Revised Concrete Haul Route for Peirce Island Wastewater Treatment Facility Work**

PORTSMOUTH, NH – The City of Portsmouth has allowed a modified haul route for concrete trucks delivering materials to the City’s upgrade of the Wastewater Treatment Facility at Peirce Island. The modification allows the concrete trucks to use the Route One Bypass from the Portsmouth Traffic Circle to Market Street. This new traffic route for concrete trucks only is in lieu of requiring them to travel on Route 95 to Market Street at Exit 7.

This modified route, shown below, will allow the concrete company, which is located on Peverly Hill Road, to reduce the overall travel time to the site. This is important because there is a stipulated timeframe between when the concrete is first mixed and when it arrives to the site. This time frame is reduced in the hotter months of the year and this extra time will prevent the need to return batches of concrete to the concrete plant. This change is not anticipated to have impact to the public, does not modify the stipulated haul routes in the City center and does not change construction schedule requirements.
