

Activity Description: The club provides a safe and fun biking atmosphere that nurtures a love for cycling and the outdoors. Our goal for each student is the same – an unforgettable experience.

The program is conducted at the Portsmouth High School utilizing the high school cross country course. This set of trails departs from the back of the high school and winds through surrounding wooded areas passing near a few Portsmouth neighborhoods. The trails are pretty straight forward and an excellent place to learn mountain biking skills. There program has a few available bikes and helmets for students who do not own a bike.

### Ski Club

Activity Description: Students who sign up for Ski Club will participate in 6 after school trips to Gunstock ski resort in Gilford, NH.
