### **Public Meeting on Peverly Hill Road Improvement Project to be held Wednesday, July 27<sup>th</sup>**

PORTSMOUTH, NH – The Department of Public Works will be holding a second public meeting on the Peverly Hill Road improvement project on Wednesday, July 27<sup>th</sup> from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. in the Public Library's Levenson Room to review potential design plans.

This meeting follows the receipt of Federal funding in April for the initial engineering and conceptual design of sidewalks, bike lanes and drainage improvements on Peverly Hill Road. A public meeting was held in May to give interested parties a chance to provide their input before the conceptual design began in earnest.

The purpose of this meeting will be to present the three design alternatives for the corridor based on the previous input. The City's consultant, McFarland Johnson, will present the alternatives as conceptual plans, as no detailed engineering has been done to date. This meeting will offer another opportunity for residents to offer feedback on the presented plans as well as other ideas to improve the features and safety of this area.
