1. <u>PUBLIC HEARING – REVISIT MCINTYRE INITIATIVE PETITION</u> – A public hearing was held with <u>44</u> speakers.

- 2. <u>Motion made by Assistant Mayor Lazenby, seconded by Councilor Perkins to deny the Revisit McIntyre Initiative Petition for the following Reasons:</u>
 - Regarding the McIntyre opportunity, this City Council was elected to follow through on a public/private partnership that provides significant benefit and minimal cost for the residents and City of Portsmouth;
 - Following all five requests of the petition would jeopardize a viable project informed by public input that will provide a renovated site with numerous public benefits while also collecting substantial revenues to relieve taxpayer burden;
 - The delays that would result from the requests in the petition would create risk to finally completing a process to acquire the McIntyre site.
- 3. Motion made by Councilor Becksted to postpone the vote on the petition and seconded by Councilor Denton FAILED on a 1-8 vote. Councilor Becksted voted in favor.
- 4. **VOTED** on an 8-1 roll call vote to deny the Revisit McIntyre Initiative Petition. Councilor Becksted voted opposed.
- 5. <u>Adjournment</u> at 10:30 p.m. voted unanimously to adjourn.
