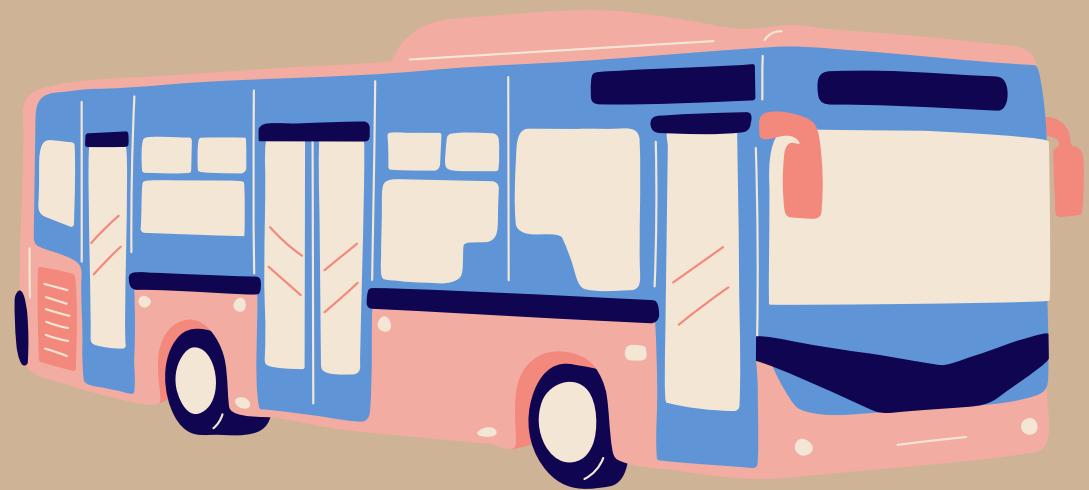

Transportation Services Grants Totaling: \$163,000

- Providing public transportation to elderly residents and persons with disabilities so they can maintain independence, attend doctor /other appointments, and shop for groceries and household needs.

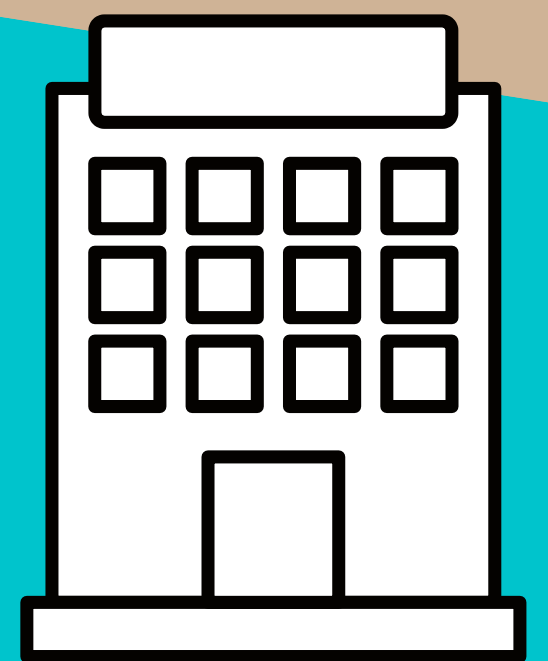
Agency Partner: *Cooperative Alliance for Seacoast Transportation*

Emergency Shelter

Grants Totaling: \$79,000

- Providing additional overnight shelter beds, food delivery and intensive case management to individuals and families experiencing homelessness.
- Adding additional temporary beds and space at warming centers and supporting hotel overnight stays and food delivery provides safe distances to meet CDC guidelines.
- Shelters are serving survivors of domestic violence, the chronically homeless, and those experiencing a temporary period of homelessness.

Agency Partners: *Operation Blessing, HAVEN, Cross Roads House*



Community Health Services

Grants Totaling: \$15,000

- Providing funding for home visiting health care case workers and adapting the mobile health clinic for continued community support amidst growing health concerns.
- Supporting increases to case management and addressing barriers to remote services in health care for persons living with HIV/AIDS.
