How does the Fall Reading Challenge work?

- ① Sign up at the children's desk to receive a challenge booklet.
- ② When you have read a book that matches the description in one of the boxes, cross out the box (or color it in or put a sticker on it).

A book can only count for one box. The goal is to read 50 different books.

③ When you have completed all of the boxes, bring your booklet to the children's desk to receive your prize. If this is the first reading challenge that you have completed, you will get your very own PPL canvas book bag and a patch of your choosing. If you have already earned a bag in a previous challenge, you get to choose a new patch.

Please ask a librarian for help if you are having trouble finding the books that you need. Here are some ways in which we can help:

Pointing out genre stickers on the spines of books. Did you know that all of our dinosaur picture books have a dinosaur sticker on the spine? Showing you the baskets of books that we have placed around the room. The books match the subjects in the boxes of your challenge booklet.

Bringing you to the correct section of the library to find the book that you need.
