

## How does the Spring Reading Challenge work?

- ① Sign up at the children's desk to receive a challenge booklet.
- ② When you have read a book that matches the description in one of the boxes, cross out the box (or color it in or put a sticker on it.)
- ③ When you have completed all of the boxes, bring your booklet to the children's desk to receive your prize. If this is the first reading challenge you have done, you will receive your very own PPL book bag and a patch. If you have already earned a book bag in a previous reading challenge, you get to choose a new patch for your bag.

Please ask a librarian for help if you are having trouble finding the books that you need. Here are some ways in which we can help:

Showing you the baskets of books that we have placed around the room. The books match the subjects in the squares of your challenge booklet

Bringing you to the correct section of the library to find the book that you need

Pointing out genre stickers on the spines of books. Did you know that all of our dinosaur picture books have a dinosaur sticker on the spine?
