Wayfinding Bid Questions

Bid 48-24 - Addendum 1

1. Can you please confirm if the removal is required? as we see in the attached below snaps, that says we need to confirm prior to bid submission. What is the scope for removal if you could specify the details please?

NOTE: Sign Contractor to coordinate the removal or movement of interfering existing signs on poles, with the city.

Removal Of Existing Signs (if Requested as part of the Bid)

The CONTRACTOR shall remove all existing wayfinding, directional and trailblazer signs as indicated in the Comments section of the project Message Schedule. This work shall be sequenced and coordinated with the installation of the new sign program.

Removal of existing signs shall be included in the CONTRACTORS, Lump Sum Project Cost.

 CONTRACTOR shall confirm with the OWNER prior to submitting their bid, the full scope of work related to removal, including footer removal, post removal and disposal.

Response: The City will coordinate removal of signs on poles or lamp posts within the City right-of-way. The City will also coordinate the NHDOT permitting process for signs that are to be removed within the State right-of-way. Signs noted for removal in the Programming bid documents shall be included in the Contractors lump sum project cost. The Sign Location Plans "Photo Details" include photos of signs that are specified for removal.

2. There are no electrical signs for bid in this right? Contract language says we need electrical drawings.

Response: There are no electrical signs included in this bid. Contract specifications are outlined as applicable.

3. Are prevailing wages required, if so which county?

Response: The City does not specify wage requirements for this bid.

4. What is the warranty required on these signs

Response: Refer to the bid document "100% Design Intent Drawings" - Section 3 - Performance Specifications - Section B of the General Conditions outlines warranties required.
